Modern Martyrs: Grand Duchess Elizabeth

Born: 1st November 1864 Died: 18th July 1918

Biography

She was born in Germany and her name was Elizabeth of Hess-Darmstadt. She was one of Queen Victoria's granddaughters.

In 1884, she married Grand Duke Sergei Alexandrovich of Russia. Over time there was a lot of talk about revolution in Russia and the Grand Duke was killed in 1905. Elizabeth sold all her luxurious possessions to open a convent in Moscow that supported women who were struggling.

After years of unrest, a new political party came to power called the Bolsheviks. They punished anyone associated with the Church. Elizabeth was one of the people killed. She was made a saint (canonised) in 1981.


Activities
